Project First Step

Project First Step (PFS) is an Erie County program assisting expectant women at risk of having babies born with disabilities. PFS also provides services for families caring for children with disabilities, families at risk of having their children removed from the biological home, and families working toward reunification. Many clients live in poverty, are challenged with drug and alcohol addiction, and face additional physical, intellectual, domestic, social, and/or mental health challenges. PFS achieves a success rate for healthy, full-term babies within high-risk populations equivalent to the rate for the general population.

EHCA Vision

Residential Services

EHCA's residential program provides true homes where individuals with disabilities are surrounded by a trained and caring staff, ensuring the utmost quality of care.

The direct support professionals and program specialists work closely with residents and their families to coordinate necessary services. Adaptive technology, therapeutic equipment, smart tablets, and sensory devices are used to enrich the resident's daily experiences. Staff members create structured activities and learning opportunities that build on each person's interests and abilities.



Lifesharing

Lifesharing carefully matches a family that is paid to provide care in their own home with an individual in need of supervised living. Participants in the program receive housing, but more importantly, they are provided a home in which they can fully participate.

Options

The Options Program offers unlicensed home and community-based services to individuals with developmental disabilities in the Erie, Crawford, and Venango counties. All services are person centered and are delivered based on the individual's service plan. Each participant along with their support team determines the type of service, the level of support, and when services are requested.

SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT

Supported Employment helps individuals with disabilities obtain and sustain paid employment by offering the support and training needed to succeed. Participants learn job search strategies and receive training for specific job assignments. Periodic follow-up and ongoing support is also provided.
