EHCA programs continue to evolve and grow based on the needs of the individuals in our care. We provide services that maximize ability and participation in a variety of community settings to individuals of all ages and all levels of disability. With the promise of compassionate, therapeutic and medical support, EHCA enables people with disabilities to live their best life with purpose, dignity, and joy.

### **PROGRAM UPDATES**

- \*The Lifesharing program has welcomed two, unlicensed families and one licensed family. The department has received specialized training in Risk Management through Risk Assessments and continues to work on team building and community outreach.
- \*The Options program has been receiving kudos within the region for its excellent care. Options staff are trained to support families who care for family members at home by offering meaningful activities and social opportunities out in the community. The program also assists persons with disabilities who are capable of living independently when provided with appropriate support.
- \*The Residential program is home to more than 100 individuals living in 21 community residences in Erie and Crawford counties. Many residential homes offer 24-hour nursing care and are equipped to support the needs of residents with complex medical conditions, while also offering a warm and loving home environment.
- \*The Project First Step (PFS) program continues to provide comprehensive support and family-centered education to parents and their children with the goal of promoting family health, unity, and independence. PFS works with pregnant women, parents, infants, children, and families to help build stability and structure in an effort to preserve the family unit.

EHCA was proud to receive two awards from the Public Relations Society of America, Northwestern PA Chapter (PRSA/NWPA).


